## FORBES AFRICA MAGAZINE ACKNOWLEDGES GOVERNOR MOHOHLO

In two consecutive years since first publication last year, Forbes Africa magazine has included the Governor of the Bank of Botswana, Mrs Linah Mohohlo, in its list of Africa's Most Prominent Women. The revised list of 20 is published in the August 2012 edition of the magazine. While retaining Governor Mohohlo as one of Africa's 20 Most Prominent Women for 2012, Forbes Africa magazine has replaced nine women with new entrants to the list.

acknowledges Governor Mohohlo as "a central banker through-and-through" who has served in various capacities since joining the Bank in 1976 and as Governor since 1999. It is also highlighted that, as part of her career, Mrs Mohohlo worked for the International Monetary Fund and is the ex-officio member of the IMF Board of Governors representing the country and serves on other boards.
